1. Vision Statement

- i. To recognize the particular abilities and limitations that are God-given, and to come to appropriate life orienting decisions concerning education and vocation.
- j. To exercise constructive leadership.
- k. To appreciate the fine arts, learn to express his own creative skills.
- l. To exercise discernment and discretion in wholesome physical and mental recreation.
- m. Techniques of and enjoyment in independent study as preparation for a lifetime of progressive learning.
- n. To value intangible ideals such as loyalty, truthfulness, submissiveness to authority and purity, that are lightly valued in a secular world.
- o. To recognize the personal imperative of evangelism and missions worldwide.
- p. To appreciate our American heritage, and attain awareness of the problems that face our nation today.
- q. To realize the responsibility that the Christian has to share the Gospel with the world around him.

4. Declaration of Faith

- a. We believe the Holy bible was written by men divinely inspired by the Holy Spirit. It is the truth without errors and reveals the principles by which God will judge us. It is the true center of Christian union to believers everywhere.
- b. We believe that there is one true God existing eternally as creator of mankind, heaven and Earth. We believe in the "Trinity" of our sovereign God existing in three persons: God the Father as head of the trinity, God the son who is Jesus our savior and God the Holy spirit who is our guide: all divinely equal, all God. Genesis 1:26 "let US (trinity) make man in our image and likeness.
- c. We believe in the virgin birth of Jesus Christ: that HE (Jesus) was the word made flesh and that he is the mediator between God and man.
- d. We believe that man was created in holiness under the law of his maker: man voluntarily fell from the holy and happy state through the sin of disobedience, thus all mankind became sinners. By grace through faith, Jesus is the only way by which mankind can be saved from the law of sin and death. Upon dying in Christ we wake up to eternal life. Those who die without Christ enter into eternal damnation. There is no middle ground.
- e. We believe that according to the gospel of (St. John) subsequent to accepting the gift of salvation the Holy Spirit indwells in a believer, leading and guiding them to all truth.
- f. We believe that the church is the body of Christ of which Jesus is the Head and whose members are those who have truly received Christ by faith. The local church is a tangible expression of the body of Christ in a particular location. Since all members of the body of Christ are united in Christ by the same Spirit, they should live in love, harmony and unity, being intent on the same purpose and accepting those sectarian or denominational practices which are based on a sincere interpretation of the Bible, which do not relate to substantive doctrinal matters, and which do not in practice cause disunity or hinder the ministry. The purpose of the church is to make Christ known to lost men and to make disciples, and glorify God on earth (Acts 1:8; 1 Cor. 12:12-27; Eph. 1:20-23, Eph. 4:1-6, Eph. 4:12-16; Matt. 28:18-20; John 17; Col. 1:24-29)
- g. We believe in the ordinances of the church, that every believer of Jesus Christ should be baptized in the name of Jesus by submersion of water as an open confession of faith: being partakers of the Lord's Supper in remembrance of Jesus' death, burial and resurrection.
- h. We believe there is one baptism of the Holy Spirit by fire, and many in fillings. This empowers believers to walk in demonstration of signs and wonders, and is available to all believers: the evidence is speaking in tongues. (Acts 2:4)
- i. We believe that Holiness is a lifestyle of consecration and worship unto God.
- j. We believe that all believers should take the lord's supper in remembrance of Jesus' body and ultimate sacrifice.
- k. We believe in the glorified body resurrection of Jesus Christ: the ascension of Christ. His present intercession at the right hand of God. Jesus is coming back to earth and his appearance will be personal, visible, and per-millennial

5. School Affiliation

6. Parent Philosophy
